This vaccine protects against Tetanus, Diphtheria, And Pertussis (whooping cough) Tdap. This to be given once to all over the age of 11 to 12. Most of those in the senior citizen group, did not receive this as a child, because the pertussis vaccine was not available then. Therefore, it is important that all baby boomers plus get this vaccine. A Td booster should then be given every 10 years.
