**The parish nurses say**: Adults over age 60 should talk to their health care provider about getting the shingles vaccine. One of three people over 60 will get shingles. If you have had shingles, can still receive the vaccine. In a clinical trial, the vaccine reduced the risk of shingles by half. Shingles can lead to serious complications involving the eye, in addition to being very painful.
